THB

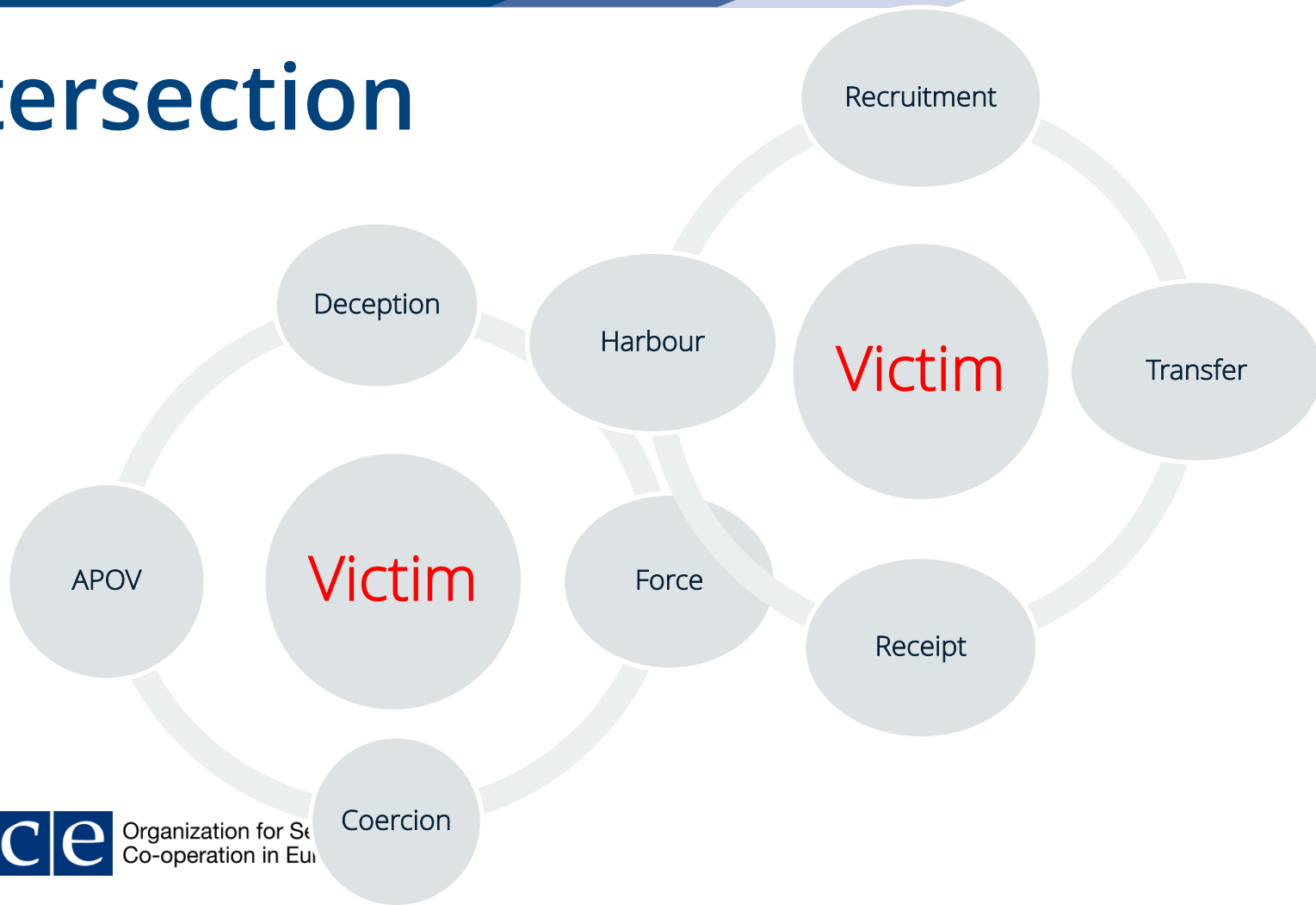
- Complementarity of legal instruments

Purpose – exploitation – money

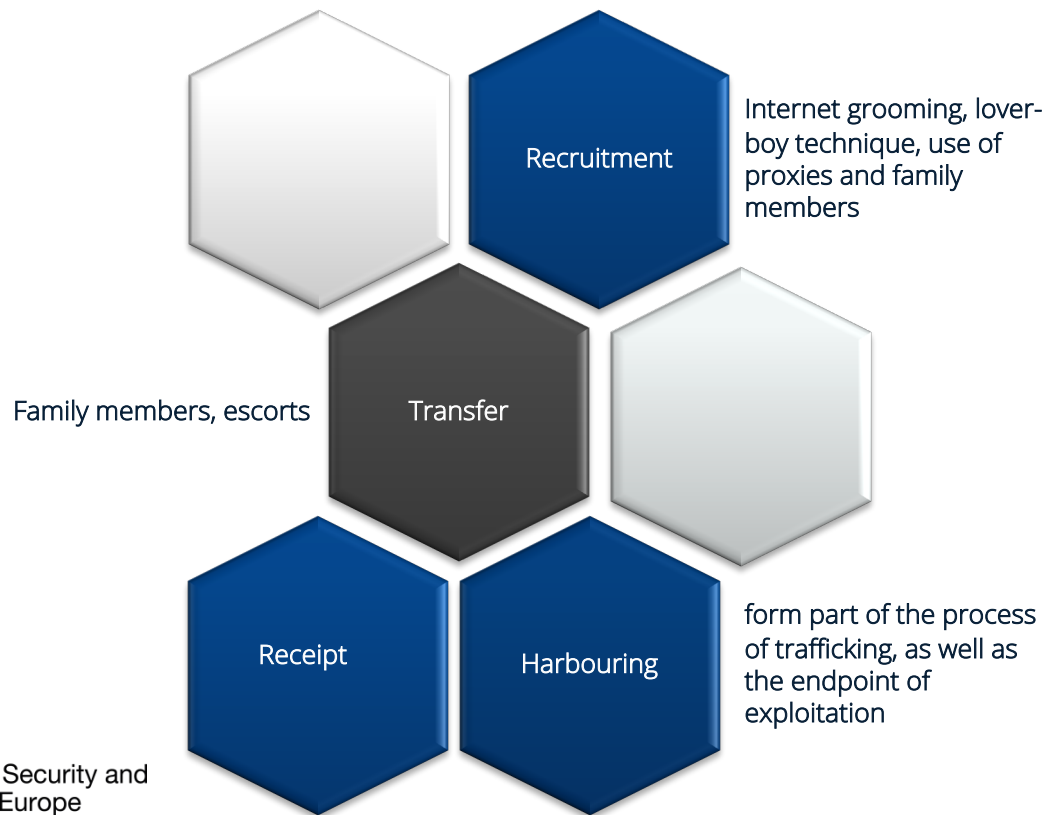
Terrorism

- No common structure similar to 4Ps
- Intent -often understood as intimidation of a population or compelling of a government or international organization to do or to abstain from doing any act

Trafficking purposes of terrorist groups



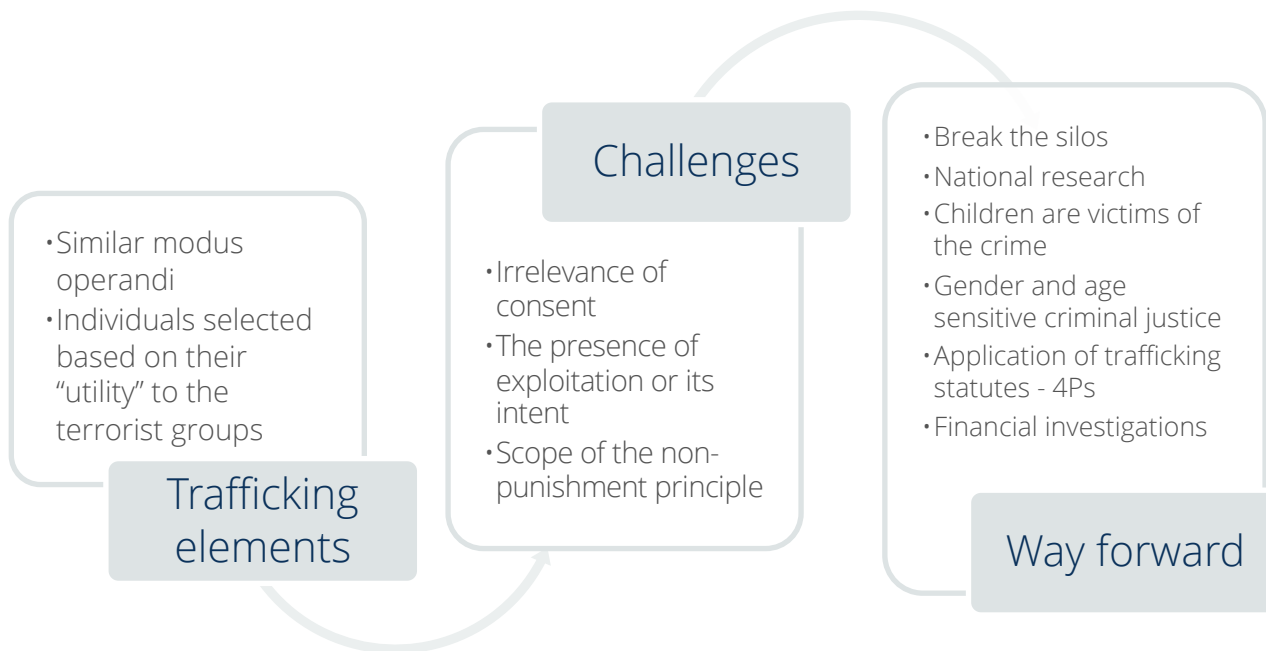
