Since 2003 many OSCE participating States have not only introduced Machine Readable Travel Documents (MRTDs) and enhanced their MRTD issuing systems¹, but have also implemented the technologically more advanced and biometrically-enabled ePassport. According to the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), currently 54 OSCE participating and Partner States issue electronic Machine Readable Passports (eMRPs or ePassports).

The steeply increasing number of electronic travel documents in circulation from different issuers underscores the utility of participating in the ICAO Public Key Directory (PKD). The PKD is a multilateral infrastructure for a facilitated exchange of public key certificates and certificate revocation lists used to verify electronic signatures that prove the authenticity of the data stored in the chips of electronic travel documents during inspection. The full certificate chain proving authenticity of biographic and biometric data stored in the chips of eMRTDs is a precondition for the verification of the identity of the bearer of an eMRTD. The reliable and timely exchange of certificates and revocation lists via the PKD replaces thousands of bilateral relationships, which increasingly cannot cope with the volume of material being exchanged.

In 2009, OSCE participating States took note of the large number of electronic travel documents in circulation and recognized the importance of strengthening and streamlining international cooperation in this field. In Athens, the OSCE participating States adopted MC.DEC 11/09 on Travel Document Security – ICAO Public Key Directory, in which they committed themselves "to consider becoming participants in the ICAO PKD, subject to administrative and financial resources, and thereby to contribute to enabling border control and other relevant national authorities to validate digital signatures of electronic eMRTDs".

To further promote the ICAO PKD, OSCE participating States tasked "the Secretary General to organize, within available resources, in co-ordination with the Chairmanship-in-Office and in co-operation with ICAO an OSCE expert workshop in 2010 in Vienna, designed to raise awareness and to facilitate the participation in and the use of the ICAO PKD by the participating States".

To begin implementing MC.DEC 11/09 and to complement previous efforts by the OSCE in the area of Travel Document Security, the Action against Terrorism Unit (ATU) in co-operation with the ICAO Secretariat and the ICAO PKD Board is organizing the OSCE Workshop on Promoting the ICAO Public Key Directory (PKD) on 27-28 May 2010, in Vienna, Austria.
