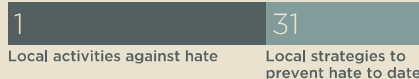

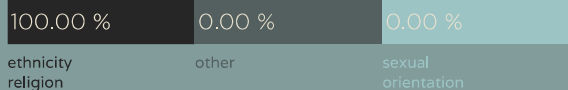

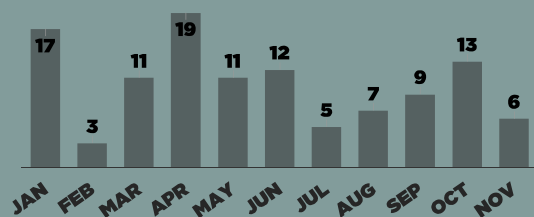

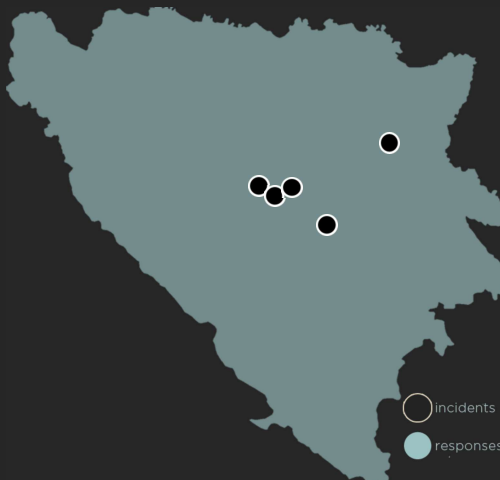

In November, to mark International Day of Tolerance, youth from three Livno secondary schools explored how street art can deliver positive messages and promote social cohesion, including by actively countering hate-driven graffiti.
