

## STATEMENT ON THE MAX VAN DER STOEL AWARD 2024

As delivered by Ambassador Ellen Svendsen at the Peace Palace, The Hague, 6 November 2024

Dear Minister, Excellencies, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I would like to thank the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands and Marek Szczygiel, Director of the office of the OSCE High Commissioner on National Minorities, for hosting this event today at the Peace Palace.

I would also like to pay tribute to the Dutch government for the establishment and sponsorship of the Max van der Stoel award, which honors extraordinary and outstanding achievements aimed at improving the position of national minorities in the OSCE area; a goal that is entirely in line with the legacy of Max van der Stoel and the work he did to establish the institution of HCNM.

Norway has been a long-standing and staunch supporter of the HCNM. Former High Commissioner Knut Vollebæk left a legacy with the organization we are proud of.

As a country with both an indigenous people – the Saami - and several groups with a long-standing attachment to the country, defined as national minority populations, - Norway recognizes the usefulness of tools and recommendations developed by the office of the High Commissioner to assist States in improving sustainable integration of diverse societies.
