It helps young women and men develop entrepreneurial skills, creates opportunities, and nurtures an environment conducive to innovative, socially impactful, and eco-friendly start-ups.

Investing in the future: enhancing entrepreneurial skills for young women and men

OSCE Scholarship Programme: Thirty young women and men aged 18-25 in the Western Balkans received scholarships to attend the summer acceleration programme at the European Innovation Academy (EIA), a recognized leader in tech entrepreneurship education. The three-week programme in which participants worked with innovation gurus to take their start-ups to the next level was held in July and August 2023 in Porto, Portugal.

Community-based activities: YDEAS held a series of community-based

activities, including innovation weekends, hackathons, workshops and seminars to increase knowledge and capacities in under-served communities.

 4-6 November 2022 Under the motto
 "Inspire, Connect, Enable", 80 participants
 took part in creative problem solving exercises
 on business, the environment, data and smart communities.
- Responsible Business Workshop, 9 December 2022 - The OSCE Presence in Albania and Deloitte Legal held a workshop for 20 young developers and start-ups on how to develop and run a start-up in compliance with local legal frameworks, emphasizing integrity as key to success.
- National Integrity Week Workshop,
 7 December 2023 The OSCE Presence in Albania organized a workshop for 16 students, entrepreneurs and startups focusing on business integrity and entrepreneurship.

Toolkit for Start-ups Launch, 7 May 2024 -The OSCE Presence in Albania in collaboration with Deloitte Legal launched the Toolkit for Start-ups, on how to establish and develop a start-up in Albania. The Toolkit launch included an interactive ideathon workshop for 21 young entrepreneurs on developing business ideas and pitching strategies, as well as information on financial sources and guidance on regulatory frameworks.

Connecting innovators and start-uppers: The Social Entrepreneurship Network

A virtual platform for entrepreneurs:

The YDEAS platform was developed to provide a space for the YDEAS community of social innovators, including investors, support services and other businesses to foster business planning, networking, exchanging experiences, projects, investment and work opportunities.

Networking and continuous learning opportunities have been hosted for entrepreneurs from different OSCE regions and networks of social enterprises through YDEAS events, workshops and study tours.

2023 Youth Forum Skopje: 17 young entrepreneurs from the Western Balkans joined other young innovators and change makers from the OSCE region in Skopje to discuss how entrepreneurship – especially social and green entrepreneurship – can address growing economic, social and environmental challenges, foster inclusive development, bridge inequalities and create peaceful, secure and prosperous societies.

Recommendations were presented at the 2023 OSCE Ministerial Council meeting.

Promoting policy-relevant dialogue

Green Paper on Social Economy in the Western Balkans – To promote policy-relevant dialogue and create an ecosystem conducive to youth entrepreneurship, YDEAS produced the Green Paper on Social Economy in the Western Balkans. The Green Paper aims to stimulate a fact-based, consultative process towards improved policy-making on reducing skills mismatch and supporting a positive business climate for social and green enterprises in the Western Balkans.

"Being a young leader does not entail waiting for opportunities, instead, it signifies the preparedness to create opportunities not only for oneself but also for others."




Petar Huska Age: 23 Serbia
