

**OSCE-wide Seminar on Passenger Data Exchange
28-29 September 2017, Hofburg, Vienna
QUESTIONNAIRE**

Information note

This questionnaire was prepared by the OSCE Transnational Threats Department (TNTD) as part of the preparation for the OSCE-wide Seminar on Passenger Data Exchange that will take place on 28-29 September 2017 in Vienna. The goal of the seminar is to provide OSCE participating States with a comprehensive understanding on the features, functions and benefits of an Advance Passenger Information (API) system, as well as the financial and technical support available from donor states and/or international organizations for implementing a passenger data exchange programme. For those participating States that already have an API system in place, this event will be an opportunity to share their national experiences and to acquire information on more advanced data exchange tools, such as interactive API and/or Passenger Name Record.

Objective

With the adoption of [Ministerial Council \(MC\) Decision 6/16](#), OSCE participating States committed to establishing national API systems in accordance with international standards. This questionnaire aims at collecting information on national passenger data exchange programmes in order to measure the level of implementation of MC Decision 6/16 across the OSCE area.

The information received from countries that already have an API system in place will be useful for identifying good practices and lessons learned to assist those participating States that are currently in process of developing their own national API system. In addition, the inputs from participating States that do not have an API system in place will prove valuable for identifying problems and opportunities in their specific passenger processing environments, to determine their technical and financial needs, and to decide how the OSCE Secretariat can best support these countries.

TNTD intends on circulating an anonymous statistical analysis on API implementation in the OSCE area prior to the OSCE-wide Seminar on Passenger Data Exchange. We thank you in advance for your co-operation!

Target Audience

We recommend that the questionnaire is completed by:

- **Officials who were involved in the establishment of the national API system**, for participating States who have an API system in place.
- **Decision makers (border security, IT development, customs, etc.) who will be involved in the establishment of a national API system**, for participating States who do not have an API system in place.
