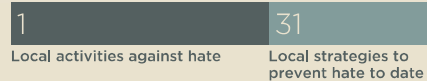

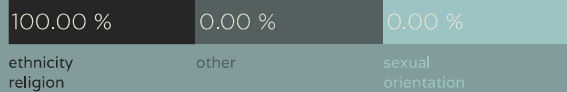

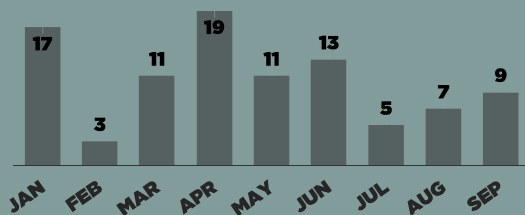

In September, youth NGOs from Kalesija and Zvornik gathered in Zvornik to celebrate achievements and strengthen inter-entity co-operation. They conveyed a positive message, calling on local institutions to collaborate more closely in addressing issues such as gender-based violence and community security. Together, they will develop joint initiatives and a project proposal, aimed at strengthening social cohesion by the end of the year.
