**Ambassador Schmid served as OSCE Secretary** General from December 2020 to September 2024. She joined the German diplomatic service in 1990 as Personal Assistant to the Minister of State for Europe and has held several important positions throughout her career. Among other things, she was political advisor to Foreign Minister Klaus Kinkel, head of cabinet to Foreign Minister Joschka Fischer and press officer at the embassy in Washington. Prior to her appointment as OSCE Secretary General, she was Secretary General of the European **External Action Service (EEAS) and Deputy** Secretary General for Political Affairs from 2011 to 2016. Previously, she was Director of the Policy Unit of the High Representative for the CFSP at the General Secretariat of the Council of the European Union in Brussels. Ms. Schmid has been nominated by Germany as their candidate to serve as the President of the 80th Session of the UN General Assembly.

Dr Lara Scarpitta is the OSCE Senior Adviser on Gender Issues in the Office of the Secretary General. She is an expert on peace mediation and Women, Peace and Security (WPS) with over a decade of experience in promoting the role of women in conflict and post-conflict countries in South East Europe and in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region. Prior to joining the OSCE, she worked for over 15 years for the EU and served in Bosnia and Herzegovina (2008-2012), Turkey (2012-2017) and Brussels (2017-2019). From 2020 to 2022 she worked as Political Adviser on Peace, Mediation and Gender at the **EU Delegation to the United Nations in Geneva, focusing** on the MENA region. She was instrumental in the creation in 2018 of the Syrian Women Platform, an EU-supported initiative linking Syrian grassroots female activists with negotiators in the UN-led Syria Peace Process. Dr Scarpitta is a member of Women in International Security - Italy and since 2019 she has also been advising the Centre for World Religions, Diplomacy and Conflict Resolution at George Mason University on Gender and Women, Peace and Security. Born in Sanremo (Italy), she holds a PhD in Russian and East European Studies and an MA in European Studies from the University of Birmingham.

Ambassador Thomas Greminger is the Director of the Geneva Center for Security Policy (GCSP) since 1 May 2021. Previously, he served as Secretary General of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) from July 2017 until July 2020. Ambassador Greminger served as Deputy Director General of the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation at the Federal

Department of Foreign Affairs from 2015 to 2017 and as the Permanent Representative of Switzerland to the OSCE, the United Nations and the International Organizations in Vienna from 2010 to 2015.

From 2004 to 2010, he served as Head of the Human Security Division of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs. Ambassador Greminger also served as Deputy Head of the Human Security Division from 2002 to 2004, and from 1999 to 2001 as Country Director at the Swiss Embassy in Maputo, Mozambique. From 1994 to 1998, he served in different posts in the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation, including Head of the Policy and Research Unit.

Ambassador Greminger holds a PhD in history from the University of Zurich. He is Lieutenant Colonel GS (company and battalion commander of infantry unit of the Swiss Armed Forces; G6 and Deputy Chief of Staff of Infantry Brigade). He has authored numerous publications on military history, conflict management, peacekeeping, development and human rights.
