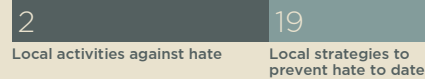

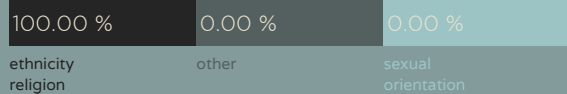

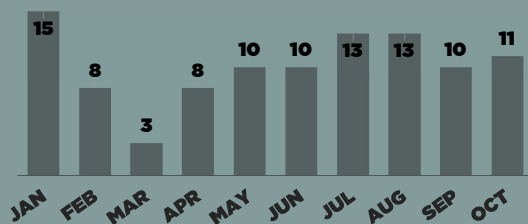

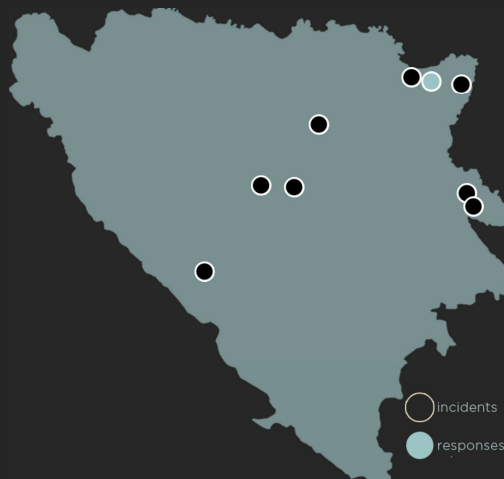

In October, the Coalitions against Hate (CaHs) in Jajce and Čapljina worked on the issue of graffiti in their respective municipalities. In Jajce, CaH activists initiated the creation of a graffiti database which will be posted on the municipality's website, while the CaH in Čapljina replaced graffiti on the pillars of the City's main bridge with murals. Both actions aim to build a positive, inclusive community atmosphere.
